
WILLIAM RANDOLPH HEARST MINORITY ASSISTANTSHIPS

he Graduate School of Arts and Sciences at Wake Forest University is pleased to announce the William Randolph Hearst Minority Assistantship Program for under-represented minority students entering a Ph.D. program in Biology, Chemistry or Physics for the 2003-2004 year.

Each one-year assistantship provides a full tuition scholarship and a calendar year stipend of at least \$18,000. Recipients must carry a full academic load (9 hours) and may be required to perform 12-15 hours of work per week in the department of study.

A prospective student must submit an application for admission to the Wake Forest University Graduate School of Arts and Sciences and state that he or she wishes to be considered for a Hearst Assistantship.

An applicant must be a United States citizen and belong to one of the following under-represented minority groups: African American, Hispanic (including Puerto Rican), Native American, Alaskan Native or Native Pacific Islander.
