A Place to Do Chemistry

The Chemistry Center is much more than just a drop-in tutoring center. It is a place where chemistry students can meet others to work on chemistry assignments, study, and interact with course material in new and unique ways. Text books, solution manuals, and molecular models are all available for students to use in the Center. All Chemistry Center tutors are chemistry majors or graduate students, trained in helping students improve their problem-solving skills within the field of Chemistry.

Drop-In Tutoring

All services offered by the Chemistry Center are FREE. Drop-in tutoring is available Sunday through Thursday throughout the academic semester and during finals week. No appointment needed! Students will be helped by a first-come, first-serve basis. Peer-to-peer learning is promoted and facilitated by Center instructors. Questions from lecture material will take priority over those regarding laboratory course material.

Supplemental Instruction

In addition to drop-in tutoring, the Chemistry Center runs a supplemental instruction (SI) program for all introductory classes. Chemistry Center instructors are matched with an instructor in lower-division courses to provide a high-resolution, unique group tutoring experience. SI leaders run two 1-hour supplemental instruction sessions each week, where students work in group to solve problems, play fun chemistry-based competitions, and work on study skills necessary to perform at the highest level in chemistry courses. Availability of SI for each instructor is dependent on availability of Chemistry Center instructors to attend specific lectures. SI leaders and associated lecture sections will be listed on the Chemistry Center website each semester.
